

Top Tips for Revision in Drama

- Active revision (past paper questions, making mind maps, making flash card retrieval questions)
- Small chunks at a time Set a timer for 30 minutes: 20-minute revision, 5-minute break, 5-minute recap of what you have just revised.
- Find a quiet space with no distractions.

Key Revision Techniques

- Flashcards of key terminology and definitions use the Leitner system.
- **Mind-maps of key information** e.g. mapping design decisions for a character's costume design linked to key moments in the play and points of context.
- Knowledge Organisers/Revision guides to add depth to your mind-maps/flashcards.
- **Re-read/watch An Inspector Calls**, look at the journey of each of the characters, pick out key moments for each character, research the social and historical context of the play.
- **Practice** applying class design concepts & character interpretations to various extracts within An Inspector Calls, using our structure IWHWKEL.
- **Explore information practically where possible** physicalise and vocalise character's actions/reactions.
