

It is important that your child writes down 3 choices they are prepared to do. There are over 750 students in KS3 so arranging who is doing what is not an easy task. In the event of your child not receiving any of their choices, we will contact you as soon as possible and discuss what is still available.

To help with your choices we have organised the activities according to Non Residential, UK Residentials, Foreign Residentials and budget friendly alternatives based at the College.

General Information

Any received before 28th October will be returned to the student.

Correspondence

All correspondence and communications regarding Enrichment Week will be sent via School Gateway, therefore it is essential that parents/Carers sign up for School Gateway and ensure we have a valid email address for you on record.

Deposits

Some of our activities are quite expensive and require parents to pay a large deposit payment by the end of **November 2019** to secure a place.

It is always difficult for us when parents make substantial payments and then a child changes their mind. **If this happens the outcome is likely to be the loss of any monies paid for the original choice and additional payments for the new activity.**

Please make sure that your child is motivated and enthused by their chosen activities and that their commitment is not in question. Students must want to do all 3 of their chosen activities.

Payment Deadlines

Each activity has a payment schedule that must be met to allow us to make payments to travel operators, visitor attractions and activity providers. Please ensure that all deadlines are met and paid in full as this is the only way your child's place on their chosen activity will be secured and maintained.

Failure to meet payment deadlines will result in the withdrawal of your child from their chosen activity and reallocation to one which is based locally.

Insurance: Details of the insurance cover can be made available on request.

The Process

1. Choice

All students must:

- Choose **three** different activity options*
- Return the Choices Reply Slip to the Curriculum Support Office by **Wednesday 30th October 2019**. **Offers will be made on a First Come, First Served basis.**

*If a reply slip does not have 3 choices it will be returned to the student to complete and in doing so will lose it's place in the queue.

2. Offer

Once the options have been processed and sorted you will receive notification via School Gateway which will inform you of the activity allocated and outline the required deposit payment.

3. Confirmation & Making a Payment

You will then need to:

- Give consent to the trip via School Gateway
- Pay the **deposit payment** online via School Gateway by **30th November 2019**

The College is **not able** to accept cash or Cheque payment, however a paypoint voucher can be printed at the Curriculum Support Office if required. If you are experiencing problems paying online please contact the Curriculum Support Office for assistance.

4. Final Confirmation

On receipt of the **deposit**, your child's place will then be confirmed and a booking made in their name. You will later receive an email via School Gateway confirming receipt of your child's deposit and giving details of the future payments schedule for that activity.

5. Additional Support & Pupil Premium

As we expect all Year 7, 8 and 9 students to take part in Enrichment Week, the College is very mindful of the current economic climate and the pressures on family life. In exceptional circumstances the College will consider alternative payment deadlines to those published in the offer letter.

Students who receive Pupil Premium support are able to use a discretionary amount towards Enrichment Week.

For students who are in receipt of Pupil Premium support we are not able to accept any PP money as a deposit for activities when the activity costs more than £100 or where the amount available within your child's PP account is less than the full cost of that activity.

Things to consider

- Activities state an approximate cost and are based on all places being filled. This year, in particular, we need to warn you that **costings are approximate at the time of print**. Due to the volatility of the economic climate we are experiencing at the moment it is likely that tour operators and/or accommodation providers may change their prices and there may be additional costs requested at a later date. Where this does occur parents will be notified, in writing, of the change and the reasons for it.
- The details outlined for the week's activities are correct at the time of publication. But are subject to change.
- Failure to pay the deposit will result in your child's place being withdrawn from their chosen trip. This place will then be offered to another student.
- Deposits are non-refundable. They are used to secure your child's place on their chosen trip.
- Failure to make future payments on time may result in the withdrawal of your child's place on their chosen trip and reallocation to an activity based locally.
- It is always extremely difficult for students to change activities once a place has been allocated and accepted. Deposits paid to us will have been passed on to travel operators, accommodation providers and/or visitor attractions to secure the student's place.

What happens when there are not enough places to meet demand for an activity?

Every year we find that some activities receive too many applications for the number of places available. To decide who is successful the College *may* use the following criteria:

- The behaviour of students
- Has any student taken part in their chosen activity before?
- On which day did the student return the reply slip?
- Has the deposit been paid on time?
- Is the student in Year 9 (the final opportunity to choose an Enrichment Week activity)?

After applying the criteria we are usually able to allocate places and find alternatives for those who have not been successful.




