

Top Tips for Revision in English Language

- English Language is a skills-based paper, meaning the best way to practise is to do lots of past papers.
- Look back at your mock papers to check your marks for each question, and the suggestions for improvement.
- You should time yourself for each question so that you get used to the timings in the exam timing is often the hardest bit!
- Focus most of your revision on questions 4 and 5 on both papers this is where most of your marks are awarded.

 - Use your English classwork to remind yourself of how to answer each question.

- Practise past paper questions using the links below:
 - Time yourself writing answers.
