
Parent, Carer and Community Briefing





On the weekend of the Challenge, the College entered 4 teams: 2 teams at 35 miles and 2 teams attempting the 45-mile route, setting off from Okehampton Army camp along with 2400 other young people.

All four teams made good progress and were ahead of their planned schedules at the end of the day. After a night camping on the moor, fog again hampered navigation for a few hours, but they all made good time; the 35-mile teams making it back to Okehampton Army Camp between 1100 and 1200. The 45-mile teams arrived back soon after 4pm, everyone making it to the finish before the 5pm deadline.
